Financial sustainability in schools – NAO report

- Nationally the schools budget up by 7.7% (15-16 to 19-20) but is a real-terms reduction taking account of inflation and pupil growth.
- 8% real-terms reduction in per-pupil funding between 14-15 and 19-20 due to cost pressures: pay rises, national living wage, higher NI employer contributions, teachers' pensions, non-pay inflation and the apprenticeship levy
- DfE: savings of £3 billion efficiency savings of £1.3 billion through better procurement, £1.7bn through more efficient use of staff.
- Doesn't include cost of policy changes NFF and ESG.





National Funding Formula for Schools

- Second stage schools NFF consultation
- 10,740 schools (54 per cent) gain; 9,128 schools (46 per cent) lose; 101 LA areas will gain; 49 will lose.
- Most London LAs will lose funding Barnet estimate is 1%
- Max loss per school is 1.5% per pupil per year, max of 3% by 19-20
- Winners and losers in each LA; a very small number of schools in Barnet will gain
- High Needs funding for pupils with SEN is protected.





Early Years National Funding Formula

- New National Funding Formula for EY from 17-18
- Barnet funding per hour the same as in 16/17 for 2-year old places
- Significant increase for 3- and 4-year olds the 'notional' rate (the average rate) to providers, including schools, in 2017/18 will be £5.44 per hour compared to £4.30 in 2016/17 (The higher rate includes extension to 30 hours)
- Nursery Schools transitional protection if formula funding is below 16-17 budget level





Education Services Grant - 1

- For services such as school improvement, education welfare services, asset management and strategic planning.
- £600 million national saving by 2019/20 brought forward to 17/18. Barnet ESG £3.6million.
- A retained duties element covers statutory duties in relation to all schools (including Academies and Free Schools)
- A general fund element that relates to LA statutory duties in respect of maintained schools.





Education Services Grant - 2

- The retained duties funding is £15 per pupil, £800,000 for Barnet.
- DfE has moved it into the Dedicated Schools Grant (DSG)
 and allows LAs to retain the funding for statutory
 purposes relating to all schools.
- The Schools Forum agreed this.
- The remaining £2.8m of ESG funding relates to statutory duties in respect of maintained schools only - withdrawn entirely by 2018/19.





Education Services Grant - 3

- Transitional ESG funding for 17-18 £985,000 for Barnet so lose £1.8m in 17/18, rising to £2.8m in 18/19
- LAs may retain some of their schools block funding to cover the statutory duties for maintained schools
- Separate School Improvement grant for LA transitional role: £190,000 (pays for part of cost of LNI service).
- Schools Forums may agree to de-delegate further funding for school improvement but not after 18/19.
- LBB not proposing to retain funding or dedelegation in 17/18 but will need to consider the position in respect of 2018/19





Apprenticeship levy - 1

- 0.5% on salaries but allowance of £15,000, which excludes employers with pay bills below £3m
- Most secondaries pay on salary bill above £3m; so £4m pay 0.5% on £4m-£3m = £5k.
- Most VA and Academy Primaries will not have to pay (unless in a chain)
- LA is the employer for community schools, so LBB has to pay £413,000 for community school staff
- Per community primary school is between £2k and £15k
- Many LAs passing this on





Apprenticeship levy - 2

- LBB proposing to invest in apprenticeships
- Employers can draw on training credits to support apprentices
- Awaiting committee/council decision on payment of the levy for community schools
- To be reviewed in future but affected by schools' take-up of apprentices
- The council will support schools with apprentice recruitment
- Schools pay salary at least the Barnet Living Wage.





School Budgets in 2017/18 - summary

- Cost pressures 1.5% (NAO)
- Funding formula for Barnet the same as in 2016/17 AWPU as in 16-17 (+£10 for secondaries)
- Minor change in IDACI bands by DfE same overall percentage.
- MFG -1.5% set by the DfE, +2.25% for winners
- EY funding up; SEN funding protected
- Unified Reward council paying pay protection for community schools in year 1 and HR costs for VA schools
- Apprenticeship levy and ESG not passing levy to community schools in 17/18 or ESG to maintained schools





Outstanding issues for 2018-19

- Cost pressures 1.6% in 18/19 and a further 1.8% in 19/20
- NFF average 1% cut over 2 years (max 3%)
- EY continues at higher rate; SEN protected
- Possible passing on of Apprenticeship Levy to community schools
- Possible passing on of ESG cuts to maintained schools
